Ask him what he likes most about living in his own apartment and David MacLeod will respond with a short answer loaded with meaning, "Because it's part of my dream." And David has big dreams.

Currently 31, David works at Kawartha Cardiology Clinic. He has worked there for the last three years, and is a valuable full-time employee who takes care of sorting, washing and folding the laundry, cleaning the parking lot and getting the mail for the doctors each day. He loves his job, but his dream job would be to become an actor. Movies, television, commercials, theatre and directing, David wants to do it all. He made his first acting appearance in a short film with his brother, Cory, entitled 'Get off my Lawn.' He caught the acting bug soon into making that first film. Again, if you ask David why he wants to be an actor, he will repeat his mantra, "Because it's part of my dream."

Outside of work, David regularly volunteers with the Salvation Army and the Breakfast Club, and has played the symbol with the Peterborough Concert Band for the past five years. His love for music is so great that another part of his dream is to learn how to

play the piano. He has just recently started lessons with local piano teacher Alli Pfaff.

David's big dreams make his mother, Jane MacLeod, smile proudly. It was her own dream to see her eldest son move out of the family home so he could become "the best version of David he could be." She continues, "Not everyone believed that getting David his own place was the best idea, some friends and family members were skeptical, but I love how he has taken charge of his life and he is happy. We have supports in place to make sure he has everything he needs and we have worked hard to ensure that the supports are natural friendships, rather than just hired support."

David likes the fact that he can organize his apartment the way he likes it; he loves to keep his space clean and enjoys entertaining his friends, Meagan and Brian. "I am delighted with his degree of independence," says Jane. "It is hard to push your children out of the nest, but this was the right choice."

Ask David why it was the right choice and he will respond, "Because it's part of my dream."

Dreams of Peer Leadership

It is the dream for many of the young women we support to be empowered, to know and feel their worth, to believe their voice and their opinions matter, to know how to assert themselves, to understand how to be all they can be; young women who have the knowledge, confidence and skills to navigate through their world, their challenges and their dreams.

Community Living Peterborough is pleased to announce the second phase of our Young Women's Leadership Group, a series of facilitated workshops to empower young women living with an intellectual disability who live throughout the County and City of Peterborough. A year-long program, the Young Women's Leadership Group encourages young women living with an intellectual disability, who are dedicated to increasing knowledge and awareness about healthy relationships and abuse, to share

the message about these important issues with their peers and other women. With the successful completion of phase one of this group, which was funded by Status of Women Canada, phase two of this project was made possible with a substantial grant from the Canadian Women's Foundation: "Canada's only national foundation that helps women and girls reach their full economic and social potential." It is the approach of the Canadian Women's Foundation that when you teach young women about what a healthy relationship emulates, they will learn to recognize the early warning signs of abuse.

It is an unfortunate fact that half of all women in Canada have experienced at least one incident of physical or sexual violence since the age of 16. In fact, young women are especially at risk with 66% of all female victims of sexual assault under the age of 24, and 11% under the age of 11. As 60% of women living with a disability will experience some form of violence, Community Living Peterborough is dedicated to empowering the young women we support in hopes of decreasing

not only their risk, but that of their peers as well.

Over the course of this year, these young women will be involved in workshops addressing issues of recognizing abuse, expressing feelings, setting boundaries, building healthy relationships, public speaking skills and more. The young women will be advancing these learned skills by mentoring and speaking to other young women about the importance of these issues. This program will work in collaboration with the YWCA, the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre, and the United Way in order to share resources and expand on the valuable skill sets these women will develop.

Jack's Corner: Message From the C.E.O.

Singer and songwriter John Lennon sang in his number one hit song, *Imagine*, "You may say I'm a dreamer, but I'm not the only one. I hope someday you'll join us. And the world will live as one."

Originally released in 1971, Lennon's words still ring true today and definitely relate to the collective dream of the seven families who joined together in 1953 to fight for their children, who lived with intellectual disabilities, to have the right to attend neighbourhood schools. Over the course of Community Living Peterborough's near 60 years, the dreams of those seven families have been realized 64 times over.

Coming up on our 60th Anniversary, we now provide supports and services for 466 people in the Peterborough area. Each person we support has their own dreams. These dreams vary in size and come in many forms; some dream for themselves, while others may dream for the world. Just like your dreams, their dreams set the course for their lives and become their reasons for working, living or playing. The people featured in this month's newsletter have all shared their dreams here with you.

David has a strong desire to perform, to make others happy through his music, acting and his contagious smile. Bill and Reese share the dream to live in a home they decorated

themselves and to feel connected with their community. Each of the women in the Young Women's Leadership Group share the dream to make the world a safer and more accepting place for women. Iain is currently living his dream as a valued member of the Peterborough Petes team.

Our Wish Fund and *Home of Our Own: 100 Homes for 100 People* campaign provide substantial means to fulfill the dreams of the people we support. We are helping people via the Wish Fund to realize such dreams as owning new orthotics or dentures, taking a family vacation or attending an event with friends, and with *Home of Our Own*, we are helping people move into a home that they can truly call their own. Within the first year of our five year campaign, we have provided homes for 21 people and have raised over \$2 million dollars. We have four years remaining to help another 79 people realize their dream of a home in which they can become the King or Queen of their own castle.

This holiday season, I ask you to think of our *Home of Our Own* campaign and Wish Fund. Make it your wish to fulfill the dreams of others in your community. Remember, a life without dreams is a life without hope.
